Present Perfect:

For; since; yet; never; always; so far; # times; many times; lately; recently; already

Past Perfect:

Already, before, by, by the time, once, only, until, yet.

Future Perfect:

We use the future perfect simple (will/won't have + past participle) to talk about something that will be completed before a specific time in the future. The guests are coming at 8 p.m. I'll have finished cooking by then. On 9 October we'll have been married for 50 years.

Present Perfect Continuous:

I have been living in this house for 40 years. ...

I have been climbing up this mountain for over two hours.

...

I have been waiting for you since 10 am.

I've been thinking about you since you called.

He's been singing for two hours.

Past Perfect Continuous:

For (a period of time) I had been driving for 3 hours.

Since (a specific time) I had been driving since 5am.

All (morning/afternoon/evening/night/day/week/month/year)

Future Perfect Continuous:

In November, I will have been working at my company for three years.

At five o'clock, I will have been waiting for thirty minutes.

When I turn thirty, I will have been playing piano for twenty-one years.

On Thursday, I will have been knowing you for a week.
